Objective




- Aim:

- AKIS Steering Group actors (DAFM, ACA, Teagasc)





AKIS Actors in Ireland (Draft v0.2)


AKIS stands for Agricultural Knowledge and Innovation System and includes farmers, advisors, researchers, and anyone working in Agriculture and the Rural Economy. AKIS is the combined organisation, knowledge flow, integration and interaction between people, organisations and institutions that produce, disseminate and use knowledge and innovation for agriculture and interrolated activities in rural areas.

The vision for the Irish AKIS is to better connect people and organisations through dynamic and consistent engagement to facilitate improved and speedier information flow. A successful AKIS will ensure actors have the training and skills to be more responsive to societatic inalienges such as climate change and sustainable food systems and to the growing information needs of farmers, rural economy actors, advisors, researchers and other agrid-food system and bloococomy stakeholders to address these challenges.

Objectives




- Collaboratively developed by the AKIS Steering Group (DAFM, ACA, Teagasc, CAP Network Ireland).
- Aim is to better understand the current needs of farmers in relation to how they currently source knowledge and information.
- The results will inform activities to help ensure a wellfunctioning Irish AKIS that connects people, facilitates knowledge flows and is more responsive to the growing information needs of farmers and other stakeholders.
- Survey Launch: 25/7/24
- Survey Close: end Sept.
- Responses to date: 250

Initial Insights - General

- Roles: 55% of respondents are part-time farmers
- Education: Approximately 30% have full agricultural training, 30% have basic agricultural training and 30% practical experience only
- Schemes: 80% are participating in BISS and 65% in ACRES
